Leaf Pickup - 'Tis Almost the Season

While it still looks pretty green out there, long-time Hillbrook Tall Oaks residents know that what grows up, must come down... and it comes down in droves here. That means only one thing: It's almost leaf pickup time!

As residents of Leaf Collection Pickup Zone 8, all neighborhood residents receive vacuum leaf collection services from Fairfax County three times per season at dates to be determined soon. Once dates are firm, Fairfax County will post yellow signs at entrances into and out of the neighborhood with estimated pickup dates so we can prepare to get those leaves out to the curb well in advance.

According to the website https://www.fairfaxcounty.gov/publicworks/recycling-trash/leaf-collection-dates, weather, rate of leaf drop and other various factors may affect our exact pickup dates, so please keep that in mind as we all prepare for "Leafapalooza 2018" this year.

As you prepare, please also remember that leaves blown into the street after crews or residents have cleared their yards can be a real hazard. Schoolchildren and our own walking neighbors must be careful when having to step into the middle to get around leaf piles. School buses and cars are reduced to one lane, creating another hazard. Please be considerate and keep the leaf piles curbside, not in the street.

Dominion Energy Repair Update

HTOCA Board representatives met with Dominion Energy earlier this year to resolve a rash of electrical outages affecting residents in our neighborhood, particularly on Kingston Drive. Dominion agreed to collaborate with us to resolve the issue and built a remediation plan. Nice job advocating on our neighbors' behalf, HTOCA Board!

Now that summer storms and outages are behind us, this **outage repair work is scheduled to begin in early November**, according to our contacts there. Watch this space for additional updates as we get them.

Don't Forget to VOTE! Tuesday, November 6

As residents of Voting District 8 here in the Poe Precinct, anyone who is age 18 or older, eligible AND registered to vote will have their opportunity on Tuesday, November 6. Included on the General Election ballot are candidates for U.S. Senate as well as the U.S. House of Representatives in our own Congressional 8th District.

Your voting location is Thomas Jefferson High School (6560 Braddock Road, Alexandria). Need to vote absentee? Tuesday, October 30 is the deadline to apply for an absentee ballot by mail, fax or online.

You may also vote in-person until Saturday, November 3 at Mason Governmental Center (6507 Columbia Pike, Annandale) on weekdays from 3-7 p.m. and on Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.
