SPIRIT OF GIVING DRIVE A WILD SUCCESS FOR ANNANDALE HIGH SCHOOL'S FOOD PANTRY

The generous neighborhood residents of Hillbrook Tall Oaks helped contribute more than 400 items in just two weeks to the Annandale High School (AHS) Food Pantry as part of our second giving event in 2021, The Spirit of Giving Food Drive.

Co-organizers Laurelie Wallace and Katie Clary provided this recap:



"Thank you, residents of Hillbrook Tall Oaks, for participating in this great cause and supporting those in our community! Our community hosted four drop-off sites to collect a variety of needs for the more than 65% of AHS students and their family members who experience food insecurity.

The food pantry, which just celebrated its third year of serving members of the AHS community, offers bimonthly family distributions (<u>Annandale High School PTSA - Fairfax County, VA - AHS Pantry Distribution Dates (membershiptoolkit.com)</u>) as well as twiceweekly student distributions, emergency needs and gift cards for emergency situations.

It also partners with Food for Others and Fairfax Diaper as well as other community businesses, neighborhoods, girl scout troops and churches. The pantry is solely supported through monetary and in-kind, nonperishable food and pantry item donations.

We are planning another "Make All Residents Charitable Heroes (MARCH) giving event in a few months for more information or to volunteer."

WORKING TOGETHER TO KEEP OUR NEIGHBORHOOD SAFE

New HTOCA Board Member **David Decker** submitted this article:

We are all fortunate to live in a beautiful, peaceful community here in Hillbrook Tall Oaks with its quiet streets and park-like setting.

We are also living in a time of increasing crime around us in the wider Annandale area, and our neighborhood is certainly not immune to this unfortunate element of modern life. While crime prevention is the role of the Fairfax County police, officers cannot be everywhere. They need our eyes and ears, and our awareness is particularly important now given current reports of FCPD staffing shortages at the same time that the county is experiencing rising crime rates.

So as we go for jogs, walk our dogs and stroll with the kids, what should we do if we see suspicious activity or something that just doesn't "feel right"? The Fairfax County Police Department recommends the following:

- DO take note of as many details as you safely can, such as the description of the activity, the time of the day, the location, and any descriptive details of the individual(s) involved.
- **DO** note vehicle descriptions and license plate numbers, as well as any other observations that may help officers locate the individuals of concern.
- **DO NOT** attempt to confront or challenge those suspected of engaging in criminal activity. That is the job of the police. Stay safe.
- CALL the Fairfax County Police non-emergency number to report what you have seen: (703) 691-2131. If what you are observing constitutes an emergency situation, call 911.

The HTOCA Board is working with Fairfax County to reactivate a Neighborhood Watch program in 2022, which we will share more information on in the new year. In the meantime, let's continue to enjoy our beautiful neighborhood and at the same time, help each other keep it safe and secure.


